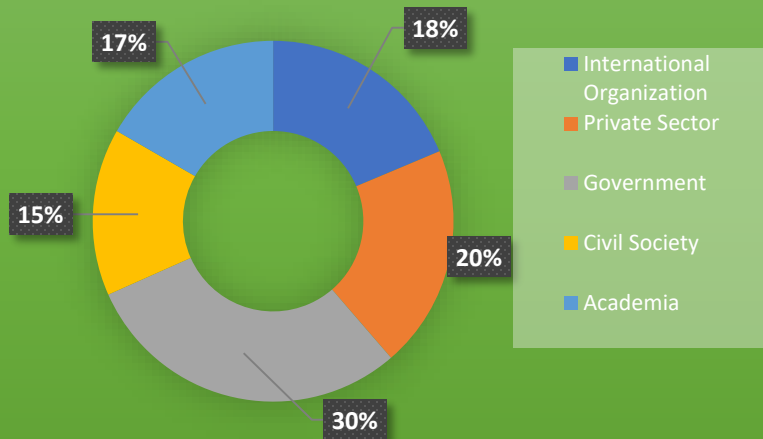

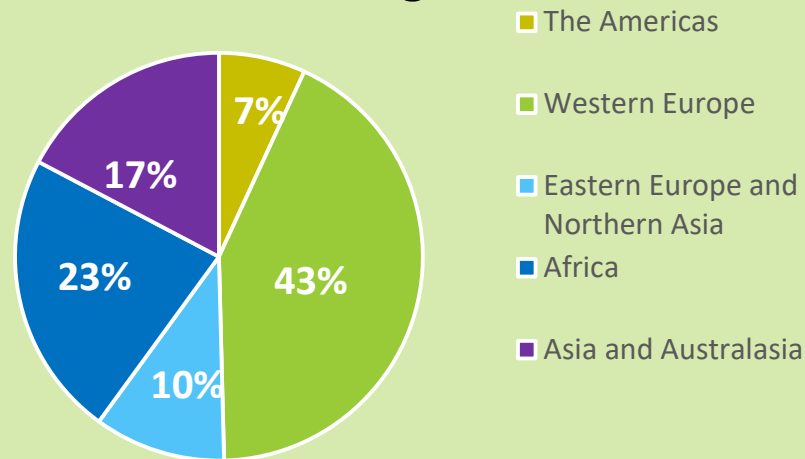


WSIS Forum 2019: PARTICIPATION

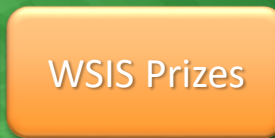



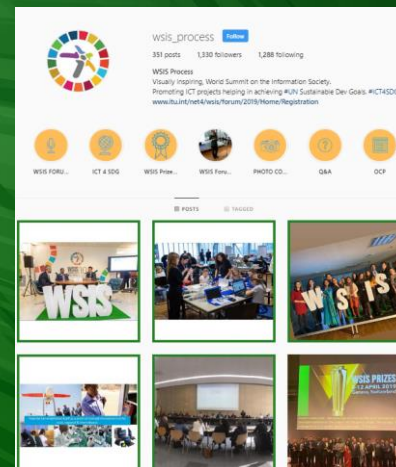
