The Future of Work initiative was proposed by the ILO Director-General in 2013 as one of the seven <u>centenary initiatives</u>. With the launch of the initiative in 2015 the ILO embarked on a <u>four year journey</u> that began with a series of <u>National Dialogues</u>, followed by the report of an independent <u>Global Commission</u> and culminating in the adoption of the <u>Centenary Declaration on the Future of Work</u> at the <u>108th International Labour Conference</u> in 2019.


The 108th session of the International Labour Conference marked the 100th anniversary of the ILO and concluded its Future of Work initiative.
